CHAPTER 19

ATTORNEY-GENERAL¹

To make provision for the establishment of the office of Attorney-General and to define the duties, powers and functions of such office.

(24th December, 1891)

Short Title.

1. This Proclamation may be cited as the Attorney-General's Proclamation.

Interpretation and Creation of Office of Attorney-General.

Powers of Attorney-General.

3. For the prosecution of crimes and offences which may have been or may be committed within Botswana,³ all and singular the rights, powers, functions, and duties conferred or imposed by the law of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope upon the Attorney-General of the said Colony, shall, *mutatis mutandis*, be conferred and imposed upon the Attorney-General.
