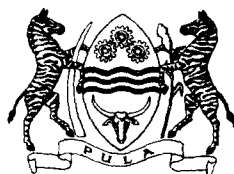


THE IMMIGRATION (CONSOLIDATION) (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1970

AN ACT TO AMEND THE IMMIGRATION (CONSOLIDATION) LAW, 1966, BY REMOVING THEREFROM ALL PROVISIONS RELATING TO ESTABLISHED RESIDENTS AND TO MAKE A CONSEQUENTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE REFUGEES (RECOGNITION AND CONTROL) ACT, 1967.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana:

Short Title

1. This Act may be cited as the Immigration (Consolidation) (Amendment) Act, 1970.

Amendment of section 2 of Law No. 19 of 1966

2. Section 2 of the Immigration (Consolidation) Law, 1966, (hereinafter referred to as the principal law) is amended by the deletion of the definition of "established resident" appearing therein.

Repeal of sections 3 and 4 of Law No. 19 of 1966

3. Sections 3 and 4 of the principal law are repealed.

Amendment of section 7 of Law No. 19 of 1966

4. Subsection (1) of section 7 of the principal law is amended by the deletion of the words "or an established resident" appearing in paragraph (a) thereof.

Repeal of section 18 of Law No. 19 of 1966.

5. Section 18 of the principal law is repealed.

Amendment of section 19 of Law No. 19 of 1966

6. Subsection (2) of section 19 of the principal law is amended by the deletion of the words "or an established resident" appearing in paragraph (a) thereof.

Amendment of section 21 of Law No. 19 of 1966

7. Section 21 of the principal law is amended as follows —

- (i) in subsection 5 (a) thereof by the deletion of the words "or who is an established resident" appearing therein; and
- (ii) in subsection (10) thereof by the deletion of the words "or an established resident" appearing therein.

Amendment of section 2 of Act No. 8 of 1967.

8. Section 2 of the Refugees (Recognition and Control) Act, 1967, is amended by the deletion of the expression and definition "immigrant" appearing therein and by the substitution therefor of a new definition as follows —

““immigrant” means any person in Botswana other than a citizen of Botswana;”.
