

**Statutory Instrument No. 83 of 1970**

**THE FAUNA CONSERVATION PROCLAMATION, 1961  
DECLARATION OF MAKGADIKGADI PANS GAME RESERVE**

(Published on the 2nd October, 1970)

In the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 6 of the Fauna Conservation Proclamation, 1961 (No. 22 of 1961), His Excellency the President declares the areas of land specified in the Schedule to be a game reserve in respect of all animals.

**SCHEDULE**

**Section 1: Ngamiland District**

Commencing at a point on the Ngamiland and Central Districts boundary at the intersection of the Boteti river and the southern edge of the ford at Matime the boundary runs north-eastwards along the southern and eastern side of the road from Matime to Bushman Pits to a point where it is intersected by the southern side of the new Maun to Nata main road; thence generally eastwards following the southern side of the said Maun to Nata road to a point one half mile west of Xhaneo Road Camp; thence southwards on a straight line having the same longitude as the aforesaid point one half mile west of Xhaneo Road Camp to the intersection of the Central District boundary; thence generally westwards and north-westwards along the said boundary to the point of commencement.

**Section 2: Central District**

Commencing at a point on the Ngamiland and Central Districts boundary described in High Commissioner's Notice No. 61 of 1961 as the intersection of the Boteti river with the meridian 24 degrees 31 minutes east of Greenwich the boundary runs in an easterly direction along the said District boundary to a point at the intersection of the line whose longitude is the same as a point one half mile west of Xhaneo Road Camp; thence southwards on a line having the same longitude as the aforesaid point to a point at Latitude 20 degrees 41 minutes south; thence south-westwards in a straight line to a point the geographical co-ordinates of which are approximately 24 degrees 33 minutes east and 20 degrees 50 minutes south; thence northwards in a straight line to a point eight miles east of a point at the junction of the southern Tsoe Veterinary Control fence and the eastern bank of the Boteti river; thence westwards in a straight line to the middle of the Boteti river; thence generally northwards following the middle of the Boteti river to a point one half mile south of the old Witwatersrand Native Labour Association (W.N.L.A.) Camp at Khumaga; thence due east for one half mile; thence due north for one mile; thence due west to the middle of the Boteti river; thence following the middle of the Boteti river generally northwards to the point of commencement.
