(22 OF 1961)

**FAUNA CONSERVATION (BAMANGWATO TRIBAL TERRITORY) HUNTING
(AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) REGULATIONS, 1970**

(Published on the 2nd October, 1970)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 4 as read with section 93 of the Fauna Conservation Proclamation, 1961 and of all other powers thereunto him enabling, the Minister of Commerce, Industry and Water Affairs, after consultation with the Bamangwato Tribal Authority and the Central District Council has made the following Regulations —

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Fauna Conservation (Bamangwato Tribal Territory) Hunting (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1970.

Amendment of regulation 10 of Statutory Instrument 64/1967

2. Regulation 10 of the Fauna Conservation (Bamangwato Tribal Territory) Hunting Regulations, 1967, (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations), is hereby amended by the deletion of subregulation 3 and the substitution therefor of the following new subregulations —

“(3) Any member, or his authorised agent, who has killed such wild animal, shall produce to the Tribal Authority as soon as possible after the killing, the skin or trophy of the animal so killed together with a statement in writing signed by the said member setting out the circumstances surrounding the killing. If the Tribal Authority is satisfied with the statement so given, and if it considers it just and equitable in the circumstances, it may issue to such member a written authority to sell such skin or trophy. Any skin or trophy of an animal destroyed or killed in accordance with this regulation which is not produced to the Tribal Authority as soon as possible after the killing, or any skin or trophy which has been produced and in respect of which the Tribal Authority has not issued a written authority to sell, shall be deemed to be the property of the Central District Council which may dispose thereof as it deems fit.

(4) Any person who fails to produce to the Tribal Authority as soon as possible a skin or trophy of an animal killed under this regulation or any person who sells or attempts to sell a skin or trophy of an animal so killed without the written authority of the Tribal Authority shall be guilty of an offence.”.

Amendment of regulation 11 of the principal regulations

3. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of subregulation 3 and the substitution therefor of the following new subregulations —

“(3) Any member, or his authorised agent, who has killed the wild animal shall produce to the Tribal Authority as soon as possible after the killing, the skin or trophy of the animal so killed together with a statement in writing signed by the said member setting out the circumstances surrounding the killing of such wild animal. If the Tribal Authority is satisfied with the statement so given, and if it

considers it just and equitable in the circumstances, it may issue to such member a written authority to sell such skin or trophy. Any skin or trophy of an animal destroyed or killed in accordance with this regulation which is not produced to the Tribal Authority as soon as possible after the killing, or any skin or trophy which has been produced and in respect of which the Tribal Authority has not issued a written authority to sell, shall be deemed to be the property of the Central District Council which may dispose thereof as it deems fit.

(4) Any person who fails to produce to the Tribal Authority as soon as possible a skin or trophy of an animal killed under this regulation or any person who sells or attempts to sell a skin or trophy of an animal so killed without the written authority of the Tribal Authority shall be guilty of an offence."

Amendment of regulation 12B of the principal regulations

4. Regulation 12B of the principal regulations is hereby revoked and replaced by the following new regulation —

"Sale of Live Animals Prohibited

12B. (1) Subject to subregulation (2), no person shall buy, possess or sell a live animal captured in the tribal territory.

(2) This regulation shall not apply to any person who is the holder of a current and valid permit under section 34 or 35 of the Proclamation permitting the capture, possession or purchase of animals for the purposes therein prescribed.

(3) Any person who contravenes this regulation shall be guilty of an offence."

Amendment of First Schedule to the principal regulations

5. Part II of the First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended in the second column by the deletion of the word "nil" where such word appears opposite the words "Ostrich (Ntshe)" where such words appear in the first column thereof, and by the substitution therefor of the word "50".

Amendment of Third Schedule to the principal regulations

6. Part (b) of the Third Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "50 cents" and by the substitution therefor of the words "25 cents".
