IMMIGRATION (CONSOLIDATION) LAW, 1966

**NOTICE EXEMPTING MEMBERS OF CLASS OF PERSONS FROM OBTAINING A
RESIDENCE PERMIT TO RESIDE IN BOTSWANA**

(Published on the 5th June, 1970)

In the exercise of the powers vested in him by Section 19 (2) (c) of the Immigration (Consolidation) Law, 1966 (No. 19 of 1966), the Minister of Health, Labour and Home Affairs hereby exempts members of the class of persons referred to in the Schedule who are in possession of valid passports from obtaining residence permits in order to reside in Botswana.

SCHEDULE

- (1) Officers in the Public Service of Botswana other than persons employed in the Gaborone Water and Electricity Unit,
- (2) Employees in the Rhodesia Railways,
- (3) Members of the United States of America Peace Corps,
- (4) Employees of the Ford Foundation,
- (5) Employees of the University of Botswana, Lesotho and Swaziland,
- (6) Members of the Chinese Agricultural Mission.
- (7) Persons recruited for service in Botswana by
 - (a) the International Voluntary Service,
 - (b) the Voluntary Service Overseas,
 - (c) the Special Commonwealth African Assistance Programme,
 - (d) the Mennonite Volunteer General Committee.
- (8) Persons recruited for service in Botswana by
 - (a) the United Nations Development Programme,
 - (b) the Branch Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees for Southern Africa,
 - (c) the United Nations Office of Technical Co-operation,
 - (d) the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation,
 - (e) the Food and Agriculture Organisation,
 - (f) the International Labour Organisation,
 - (g) the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation,
 - (h) the World Meteorological Organisation,
 - (i) the World Health Organisation,
 - (j) the International Civil Aviation Organisation,

- (k) the International Telecommunication Union,
 - (l) the International Atomic Energy Agency,
 - (m) the Universal Postal Union,
 - (n) the International Governmental Maritime Consultative Organisation,
 - (o) International Bank for Reconstruction and Development,
 - (p) International Monetary Fund,
 - (q) International Development Association,
 - (r) United Nations Association,
- (9) The privilege is also extended to wives and minor children under the age of 18 years.
