SCHEDULE

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Labour and Home Affairs by section 137 of the Prisons Act, the following Regulations are hereby made —

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| 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Prisons (Amendment) Regulations, 1988. | Citation |
| 2. The Prisons Regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") are hereby amended by substituting for the First Schedule thereto, the new Schedule set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto. | Amendment of first schedule to Cap. 21:03 (Sub. Leo.) |
| 3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by adding at the end of the list in the Third Schedule thereto, the new list set out in Part II of the Schedule hereto. | Amendment to principal Regulations |
| 4. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by substituting for the Fourth Schedule thereto, the new Schedule set out in Part III of the Schedule hereto. | Amendment to principal Regulations |
| 5. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by adding thereto, immediately after the fifth Schedule thereto, the new Sixth Schedule hereto. | Addition of new schedule to principal Regulations |

RANK	BADGES OF RANK
Commissioner of Prisons and Rehabilitation	(a) crest over crest surrounded by a laurel wreath; (b) collar gorgettes with silver oak leaf spray on green base; (c) double silver on peak of khakhi baratheia cap.
Deputy Commissioner of Prisons and Rehabilitation	(a) two stars over crest surrounded by a laurel wreath; (b) collar gorgettes with two interwound silver spray on green base; (c) single silver oak leaf spray peak of khakhi baratheia cap.
Assistant Commissioner of Prisons and Rehabilitation	(a) crest surrounded by laurel wreath on shoulder straps; (b) collar gorgettes straight silver oak leaf spray on green base; (c) single silver oak leaf spray on peak of khakhi baratheia cap.
Senior Superintendent of Prisons and Rehabilitation	(a) crest over star on shoulder straps; (b) single band on peak of khakhi baratheia cap; (c) collar lapel green badge
Superintendent of Prisons and Rehabilitation	(a) crest on shoulder straps; (b) single band on peak of khakhi baratheia cap; (c) collar rapel green badge
Assistant Superintendent of Prisons and Rehabilitation	(a) three stars on shoulder straps; (b) collar rapel green badge.
Principal Officer Assistant Principal Officer	two bars on shoulder straps; one bar on shoulder straps;

Sergeant	three chevrons on shoulder straps
Warder:	plain green shoulder straps.

WINTER:	khakhi barathea suit with long sleeves;
SUMMER:	khakhi barathea suit with short sleeves;
SHIRTS:	khakhi terrylen
JERSEYS:	khakhi
SHOES/BOOTS:	red
CAPS:	khakhi barathea
TIES:	green
LEATHER BELTS:	red
BELTS WEBBING:	green
BERETS:	khakhi barathea
OVERALLS:	khakhi shirt/green trousers
CEREMONIAL SUIT:	green with cream — white jacket flaps."
