ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS

REGULATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Commerce and Industry by section 12 of the Tourism Act, 1992, the following Regulations are hereby made —

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| 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Tourism (Amendment) Regulations, 1996. | Citation |
| 2. The Tourism Regulations, (referred to in these Regulations as “the Regulations”), are amended by inserting immediately before regulation 5 the following new regulation 4A —
“Issue of provisional licence 4A. The Board may, upon a written application by a tourist enterprise, issue a provisional licence subject to such conditions as it may in each case determine.” | Insertion of regulation 4A in S.I. No. 58 of 1996 |
| 3. The Regulations are amended by substituting, for regulation 7(3), the following new regulation —
“Duration and fees for licences and training levy 7(3) In addition to the fees specified in this regulation, every licensed tourist enterprise shall pay a training levy of One Pula per occupied bed per night which shall be paid into the Tourism Industry Training Fund.” | Amendment of regulation 7(3) of the Regulations |
| 4. The First Schedule of the Regulations is amended by substituting for paragraph 2, the following new paragraph —
“Bedrooms 2. For hotels constructed after the coming into force of these Regulations —
(1) the minimum sizes of bedrooms shall be 11 square metres for single bedrooms and 16 square metres for double bedrooms;
(2) the area occupied by built-in cupboards and vestibles shall be included; and
(3) the area occupied by balconies and bathrooms shall not be part of the size of a bedroom as defined in these Regulations.” | Amendment of First Schedule to the Regulations |
