ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS

REGULATION

1. Citation
2. Amendment of Cap 03:06 (Sub. Leg.)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the President by section 4 of the Botswana Honours Act, the following Regulations are hereby made —

Citation 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Botswana Honours (Amendment) Regulations.

Amendment of 2. The Botswana Honours Regulations are hereby amended —

Cap. 03:06
(Sub. Leg.)

- (a) by renumbering the following regulation 3 (a) (i) and (ii) and 3 (b) (i) and (ii) of S.I. No.17 of 1998 as regulations 19A (1) and (2) and 19B (1) and (2) respectively, and

- (b) by inserting immediately after regulation 19B the following new regulations —

“19C (1) The Botswana Teachers’ Silver Jubilee Medal shall be struck in sterling silver in the shape of the Botswana One Pula Coin released in 1976, diameter of 29.5 mm, round and edge of 12 scallops with smooth edge with obverse consisting of the Botswana Coat of Arms and the reverse bearing the words ‘For Botswana Teachers’ Silver Jubilee Medal’, the name of the recipient and the date of the award.

(2) The Medal shall be worn on the left breast pendent from a black bordered white ribbon. The black part being three fifths ($\frac{3}{5}$) of the ribbon.

19D (1) The Botswana Teachers’ Mid-Career Medal shall be struck in 75% copper and 25% nickel in the shape of the Botswana One Pula Coin released in 1976, diameter 29,5 mm, round and smooth edges, with obverse consisting of the Botswana Coat of Arms and the reverse bearing the words ‘For Botswana Teachers’ Mid-Career Medal’, the name of the recipient and the date of the award.

(2) The medal shall be worn on the left breast pendent from a white ribbon 4.3 cm in width.”
