TRIBAL LAND (AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE) ORDER, 1999
(Published on 23rd July, 1999)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 3(5) of the Tribal Land Act, the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing hereby makes the following Order —

Citation 1. This Order may be cited as the Tribal Land (Amendment of Schedule) Order, 1999.

Amendment of
First Schedule
to the Tribal

(Cap. 32:02) 2. The First Schedule to the Tribal Land Act is amended in the third column thereof, in respect of each land board, the name or title of which is set out in the second column thereof, by substituting the following entries for the entries in respect of —

(1) Ngwato land board, which shall have —
 “(a) 8 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
 (b) 8 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;
 (c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
 (d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and
 (e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;

(2) Tawana Land Board, which shall have —
 “(a) 7 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
 (b) 7 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;
 (c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
 (d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and
 (e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;

- (3) Kgatleng Land Board, which shall have —
- “(a) 6 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment; (Cap. 32:02)
Sub. leg.
 - (b) 6 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;
 - (c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
 - (d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and
 - (e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;
- (4) Kweneng Land Board, which shall have —
- “(a) 7 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment; (Cap. 32:02)
Sub. leg.
 - (b) 7 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;
 - (c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
 - (d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and
 - (e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;
- (5) Ngwaketse Land Board, which shall have —
- “(a) 7 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment; (Cap. 32:02)
Sub. leg.
 - (b) 7 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;
 - (c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
 - (d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and
 - (e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;

(6) Maletle Land Board, which shall have —

“(a) 6 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;

(b) 6 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;

(c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;

(d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and

(e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;

(7) Tlokweng Land Board, which shall have —

(Cap. 32:02)
Sub. leg.

“(a) 6 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;

(b) 6 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;

(c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;

(d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and

(e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;

(8) Barolong Land Board, which shall have —

(Cap. 32:02)
Sub. leg.

“(a) 6 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;

(b) 6 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;

(c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;

(d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and

(e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;

(9) Tati Land Board, which shall have —

- “(a) 6 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment; (Cap. 32:02)
Sub. leg.
(b) 6 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;
(c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
(d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and
(e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;

(10) Chobe Land Board, which shall have —

- “(a) 6 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment; (Cap. 32:02)
Sub. leg.
(b) 6 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;
(c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
(d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and
(e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”;

(11) Kgalagadi Land Board, which shall have —

- “(a) 6 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment; (Cap. 32:02)
Sub. leg.
(b) 6 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;
(c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;
(d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and
(e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”; and

(12) Ghanzi Land Board, which shall have —

“(a) 6 members, elected and appointed in accordance with the procedure described in regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations, who may hold office for 4 years and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;

(b) 6 members, appointed by the Minister of Local Government, Lands and Housing, which members may hold office for 3 years and be eligible for re-appointment;

(c) any member, appointed to replace a member referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) who’s office has become vacant, who may hold office for the unexpired period of the original incumbent’s term, and be eligible for re-election and re-appointment;

(d) 1 member representing the Ministry of Agriculture; and

(e) 1 member representing the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.”.
