

PROCLAMATION.¹

HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

No. 10, 1908.—DATED 3rd MARCH, 1908.

Preamble.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the High Commissioner's Proclamations of the 10th of June, 1891, and the 4th of July, 1893, the provisions of the "Transfer Duty Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1884," of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope are in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate (hereinafter referred to as "the Protectorate");

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the "Transfer Duty Reduction Act, 1896," of the said Colony, whereby the said "Transfer Duty Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1884," was amended by substituting for the words "four pounds" in section *two* of the said Act the words "two pounds" should also be in force in the Protectorate;

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

Applying the provisions of Cape Act No. 10 of 1896.

1. The provisions of the "Transfer Duty Reduction Act, 1896," of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope shall *mutatis mutandis* be in force and have effect within the limits of the Protectorate.

Commencement of Proclamation.

2. This Proclamation shall have force and take effect as from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
