

PROCLAMATION.¹

BY

HIS EXCELLENCY SIR ALFRED MILNER, &c., &c.

No. 17, 1897.—DATED 9th DECEMBER, 1897.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to remove doubt as to the application of the provisions of the said Proclamation to such members so enrolled.

And whereas it is expedient to make further provision for the good order, discipline and efficiency of the Police within the limits of Her Majesty's Order in Council of May 9th, 1891:

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby proclaim, declare and make known as follows:—

1. [Relates to Rhodesia.]

Rules and Regulations framed under Section 6 of Act 9 of 1878, to apply to all members of Police Force.

2. All such Rules and Regulations framed under and by virtue of the provisions of the Sixth Section of Act No. 9 of 1878 of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, as were in force in the said Colony up to the date of the repeal of the said Act by the Legislature of the said Colony shall, *mutatis mutandis*, and as far as applicable, be in force with regard to all members of the Police Forces and any forces raised for temporary service being under the jurisdiction, authority and control of the High Commissioner, employed within the limits of Her Majesty's Order in Council of May 9th, 1891.

Date of taking effect of Proclamation.

3. This Proclamation shall take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
