

PROCLAMATION.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to proclaim severe penalties in respect of the offence of inciting natives to rebellion within the limits of Her Majesty's Order in Council of May 9th, 1891:

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers, jurisdiction and authority in me vested, I do hereby proclaim, declare and make known as follows:—

Penalty for inciting natives to rebellion.

1. Every person convicted within the limits of Her Majesty's Order in Council of May 9th, 1891, by a competent Court, of the offence of inciting natives to rebellion within the said limits, may be sentenced to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for any period not exceeding seven years, or to such other punishment as it may be legally competent for the said Court to impose.

Commencement of Proclamation.

2. This Proclamation shall take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
