

PROCLAMATION.^{1, 2}

HIS EXCELLENCY SIR ALFRED MILNER, &c., &c.

No. 5, 1900.—DATED 12th NOVEMBER, 1900.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to declare that Part I. of the Police Offences Act No. 27 of 1882 of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope shall be in operation at the place styled "Francistown" and in the neighbourhood thereof within the Bechuanaland Protectorate:

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby proclaim, declare and make known as follows:—

1. [Repealed by Proclamation No. 23, 1914.]

Part I of the Police Offences Act No. 27 of 1882, put in operation.

2. The provisions of Part I. of the Police Offences Act No. 27 of 1882 of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, shall be in operation within the area shown upon the plan lodged in the Assistant Commissioner's office at Francistown and styled thereupon the area of Francistown, and also within an area extending therefrom up to the line of railway as shown upon the said plan and for a distance of one thousand yards westward from the said line of railway, between two lines formed by the extension of the streets styled First Avenue and Sixth Avenue upon the north and south sides respectively of the said area of Francistown as shown upon the said plan.

Commencement of Proclamation.

3. This Proclamation shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
