

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 121 of 1914.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE CUSTOMS.

NOTICE is hereby given that in terms of section *six* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Customs Tariff Proclamation, 1914, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that from the date of the publication of this Notice, and subject to any regulations prescribed in that behalf—

- (a) a rebate shall be allowed or a refund made of the duty which would be payable in respect of goods (not being private wearing apparel or effects, food or drink, or tobacco in any form) imported into the territory of the Bechuanaland Protectorate for the official or private use of Consuls who are subjects of the Government represented by them and are not engaged in any other business, profession, or occupation in the territory;
- (b) a refund shall be made of the duty paid on bona fide samples imported by commercial travellers or representatives of foreign business undertakings upon the export thereof from the territory;
- (c) a refund shall be made of the duty paid on goods (not intended for consumption in the territory) imported by bona fide tourists for their own personal use while touring therein, upon the export thereof from the territory.
