

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No 103 OF 1915.

IT is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased under the provisions of section *three* of Proclamation No. 11 of 1911 as amended by Proclamation No. 44 of 1915 to make the following additional regulations for the area of Francistown and the areas adjacent thereto described in section *two* of the said Proclamation:—

10. (1) No person shall slaughter any animal at any place in the said areas other than the public abattoir set apart for that purpose and situated near the Tati Company's yard at Francistown or at a private abattoir the use of which for the purpose is permitted by the Assistant Commissioner.

(2) The Assistant Commissioner shall have discretion to grant or withhold permission for the use of a private abattoir under this regulation and to withdraw any such permission once granted.

Notice (3) This regulation shall not apply to the slaughter of any
No 103 animal which is not intended for the food of man.

1915 (4) The following shall be the charges for the use of the
public abattoir which shall be paid by any person using the
same:—

2s. 6d. per head for cattle.

6d. per head for sheep.

1s. per head for pigs.

1s. per head for calves.

11. Every person carrying on trade as a butcher in any of the said areas shall take adequate steps to protect from contamination all meat stored or exposed for sale on his premises. Where a butcher does not keep such meat in a room specially set apart for the purpose he shall on being required to do so by the Assistant Commissioner provide a suitable safe at least 96 cubic feet in capacity with a metal tray at the bottom for the purpose of keeping such meat therein.

12. No person shall keep any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs in any yard or enclosure adjoining a store or dwelling-house.
