PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER

Defining the conditions under which natives not domiciled in the Bechuanaland Protectorate shall be permitted to enter into the territory.

Whereas it is expedient to define the conditions under which natives not domiciled in the Bechuanaland Protectorate shall be permitted to enter into the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby proclaim, declare and make known as follows:—

1. Every native domiciled in any part of Africa, South of the Equator, other than the Bechuanaland Protectorate, who may desire to enter the Bechuanaland Protectorate, shall be the holder of a pass signed by a person authorized to sign passes in the country from which he desires to enter the Bechuanaland Protectorate.

2. Any such native entering the Bechuanaland Protectorate without such a pass, or failing to produce such pass on demand by an Assistant Commissioner, Magistrate or Police Officer of the Bechuanaland Protectorate, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to be arrested without a warrant, and, upon conviction, to pay a fine not exceeding twenty shillings, or in default of payment to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding fourteen days.
